Core value focus: Responsibility

KEY TEXTS – The Smartest Giant in Town by Julia Donaldson

This is one of our quality stories for the term and it focuses on how we talk to others and how we make them feel happy and welcome.

One Plastic Bag by Isatou Ceesay

This story will help to raise awareness of life in another country and how being responsible for our local environment is very important. It asks these questions:

- How can we be helpful citizens?
- How can we care for our local area?

ENGLISH

JOURNEYS (FICTION)

- Studying the text 'On my way home' by Jill Murphy and learning about the story's setting.
- Use capital letters and full stops to form creative sentences about the setting and the characters.

RECOUNTS (NON-FICTION)

- Learning about the local area.
- Writing a letter home to say what they have been doing in Year One (using a post box).
- Use the conjunction 'and' to extend sentences and begin writing with the first person pronoun 'I.'

POETRY- SEASONAL

- Using their senses, the children will go on an autumnal walk and come up with a list of adjective to describe their experiences. These will then be used to create a poem.

MATHS NUMBER

- Identify, order and count on up to 10.
 - Find 1 more or 1 less than a number up to 10.
- To know number bonds to 10.
 - Count in 10s.

ADDITION AND SUBTRACTION

- Accurately use +, - and = symbols within a number sentence.
- To + and - numbers to 10 using different models (part-whole, counting on, place value models).

MULTIPLICATION AND DIVISION

- Develop understanding of the 10 times table facts.

SHAPE

- Identify 2D shapes.

DATA

- Use pictograms to explore number.

P.E.

- P.E. lessons are Tuesday and Thursday afternoons. Lessons are based on fundamental movement skills: agility, balance and coordination.
- The children will also build the skills required in order to play the sport Netball.

SCIENCE

- Identify and name a variety of common wild and garden plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees.
- Identify and describe the basic structure of a variety of common flowering plants, including trees.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

- List of objectives to cover from NCC syllabus
- This term the children will be learning about Christianity.

COMPUTING

- We will be basing our lessons on objectives covered in the Rising Stars Scheme.
- This term the children will become Treasure Hunters. They

will be creating algorithms and finding treasure on maps by programming a toy.

INTEGRATED CURRICULUM GEOGRAPHY/HISTORY

- Identifying landmarks on their journey to school.
- Investigating maps of the school.
- Drawing a simple map using symbols and a key.
- Use directional vocabulary to describe location.
- Researching Gambia and comparing life there to Northampton.

ART, DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY

- Observational drawings of areas around the school.
- Developing the skill of colour mixing in order to create Gambian art.
- Design, build and evaluate models of local area buildings.
