



Sports Premium Funding 2016- 2017

In the academic year of 2016 to 2017 we will receive £9050. Guidance on this funding stipulates that it must be spent on the sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport, benefitting pupils who join the school now and in the future. Below is a table of information that states how we will use this funding in the academic year of 2016-2017 to promote quality PE and sport at Lyncrest Primary School.

	How the funding will be used	Proposed impact	Cost
1.	To hire qualified sports coaches to work with and alongside each teacher in school, once a week, for a period of one hour, to develop practice within school, working to develop the practice and quality of teaching in the delivery of the Real PE scheme or a specific sport.	This will enhance the quality of teaching in PE now and in the future, as teachers will be up-skilled in areas they wish to develop in, thereby enhancing the sustainability of quality provision.	£4750.00
2.	To hire a qualified sports coach to run lunchtime sports clubs (aided by young leaders) in which we aim to support and involve the least active children while also ensuring every child in school gets the opportunity to participate in these clubs, thereby encouraging more pupils to take up sport. Accordingly, within these clubs we aim to introduce new sports or activities (e.g. handball) and coordinate and deliver training for upcoming extra- curricular sporting competitions.	Children should develop an enthusiasm for participating in sport and as such our children will engage in sporting activities (with knowledge of games and rules imparted through this process) on the playground without the specific supervision or guidance of an adult in years to come to initiate sports play. Additionally, young leaders will be up-skilled in leading sports for their peers, thus producing a sustainable model of lunchtime sports clubs.	£4750.00
3.	To increase involvement in sporting competitions with other schools through membership with The Duston Cluster Sports Partnership and the Northampton Town School Sports Federation aiming for over 85% participation from all children n KS2 to attend an extra-curricular sporting competition.	This continuing model is an essential yearly investment for the children to become involve in competition. The impact of it can be seen through the increasing number of children involved in competition across KS2. Furthermore, with membership to the Duston Sports Cluster (costing £562), all school staff will gain access to sports specific training, thereby increasing the sustainability of high quality teaching and learning in PE across the school	£762.00
