

In the academic year of 2015 to 2016 we have received £8,000 and an additional payment of £5 per pupil of sports premium funding. Guidance on this funding stipulates the funding must be spent on the sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport, benefitting pupils who join the school now and in the future. Below is a table of information that states how we have used this funding in the academic year of 2015-2016 to promote quality PE and sport at Lyncrest Primary School and the impact it has had.

	How the funding has been used	Cost	Impact
1.	To hire qualified sports coaches to work with and alongside each teacher in school, once a week, for a period of one hour, to develop practice within school, enhancing the quality of teaching in PE now and in the future.	£4050.00	Our qualified sports coach has imparted skills and knowledge- particularly in teaching the Real PE scheme effectively- therefore improving the teaching and learning of PE across the school. As such teachers feel confident to teach PE and the Real PE scheme independently. Furthermore, the extra adult has allowed children to be supported and extended within their learning.
2.	To hire qualified sports coaches to run lunchtime sports clubs in which we aim to support and involve the least active children while also ensuring every child in school gets the opportunity to participate in these clubs, thereby encouraging more pupils to take up sport. Accordingly, within these clubs we aim to introduce new sports or activities (e.g. handball).	£8100.00	100% of children (Year 1 to Year 6) undertook sports clubs at one point across the academic year.
3.	To increase involvement in sporting competitions with other schools through membership with The Duston Cluster Sports Partnership and the Northampton Town School Sports Federation. Our aim is to give every child in KS2, per academic year, the opportunity to attend a sporting competition.	£700.00	In KS2, 85% of children were involved in extra-curricular training for a sports competition and also attended a sports competition.
4.	To give staff training and resources to teach PE more effectively (specifically in Real Gym this academic year).	£600.00	Reception teachers and PE lead have undertaken Real Gym training and Real Gym is now being utilised to teach high quality PE in Reception, with the aim of

			implementing this across all year groups in the next academic year.
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
