



Year 6 Term 2 Curriculum Map 2018

Topic: The Lady of Shalott. (Poetry)



Core value focus: Compassion

Key Text: Song of the Sparrow.

- This story retells the story of the Lady of Shalott through a modern day story.

English

Imagery (Poetry)

- 'Rabbit in the mixer survives' by Roger McGough.
- Understand how narrative poems tell a story and have a particular form.
- Use specific techniques: extended metaphor, personification, onomatopoeia and simile.
- Retell the story by selecting the most important events.
- Children will write a free verse poem describing a sea creature.
- Correctly use dashes, colons and semi colons.

JOURNALISTIC WRITING (Non-Fiction)

- Understand the key features of argument texts and identify them.
- Understand the terms pejorative language and emotive language.
- Analyse arguments to decide which is the strongest and give reasons for why.
- Children will write an argument for a debate, persuading people to vote for the 'animal party'.

SETTINGS

- Children will write a narrative using the film 'Alma'.

Mathematics

NUMBER & CALCULATION

- Round whole numbers and decimal numbers to 10 00 000.
- Add whole numbers and decimals using multiple methods.
- Choose methods which are most appropriate to use.
- Multiply whole and decimal by 1 and 2 digits.

FRACTIONS

- Add and subtract fractions.
- Simplify fractions using common multiples.
- Understand relationship between fractions and decimals.

MEASUREMENT

- Find the area and perimeter of simple and compound shape.
- Read on and count back in intervals of 5 to solve time problems.

SHAPE

- Identify lines of symmetry.

STATISTICS

- Read and interpret information in graphs.

P.E.

- P.E. lessons each Wednesday and Friday afternoons (Real PE curriculum). Cover list of objectives from real PE.
- Cover sports specific objectives hockey skills

SCIENCE

THE CIRCULATORY SYSTEM

- Identify and name the main parts of the human circulatory system.
- Describe the functions of the heart, blood vessels and the blood.
- Describe the ways in which nutrients and water are transported within animals, including humans.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Religions in our Community: How can we build a more respectful Northamptonshire?

- Explore the different religions in Northamptonshire and those in the local area.
- Consider different aspects of those religions and how they affect communities.
- Reflect how respectful attitudes can be built.

Computing

- This unit is called 'We are app planners'.

- Children will learn about the capabilities of smartphones; think of a problem that a smartphone or tablet has and pitch an idea for an app which solves this.

INTEGRATED CURRICULUM

- This unit explores the poem by Alfred Lord Tennyson. Children will mainly be focusing on drama to do this.

DRAMA

- Children will use key questions to understand the poem and its content.
- Understand the time of the setting of Arthurian legend.
- Use drama techniques to explore the subject of the poem.

DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY

- Children will create a boat that will float on water.

ART AND DESIGN

- Recreate the painting by John William Waterhouse using watercolours.
- Illuminated letters to write their own section of the poem.

HISTORY

- Explore the Arthurian legend, focussing on examining true evidence versus legend stories .

TOPIC WRITING

- Children will retell the story of The Lady of Shalott by creating a modern twist.

Music

- Brass led by Mr Lydiard.
